



STR Application Timeline for Cohort 8 (Summer 2020 through Summer 2021)

There are two application cycles for the Seattle Teacher Residency program. Both application cycles are for the cohort beginning in late June 2020.

Application Cycle	Deadline	Selection Day*	Final Decision Notification Date
Early Application Window	October 18, 2019	December 17, 2019	January 24, 2020
Final Application Window	January 24, 2020	March 26-27, 2020 (assigned one day)	April 17, 2020

*Selection Day is a full day consisting of interviews and performance tasks and is a requirement for admission into STR.

Summer 2020 Program Calendar

Daily attendance during summer is mandatory and personal days (for weddings, travel, appointments, etc.) are not allowed during this initial quarter. Summer Quarter 2020 for STR Cohort 8 starts on June 19, 2020** and runs through August 21, 2020. Plan on daily attendance from 8am-5pm Monday through Friday. Residents then have a short break from August 22-26 before returning to prepare for the start of the school year on August 27.

**Anticipated start date. This start date may be modified due to factors (inclement weather, etc.) extending the Seattle Public Schools school year.

Eligibility

To apply for the Seattle Teacher Residency program, you must:

- Hold a Bachelor's degree by the time the program starts
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA***
- Be legally authorized to work in the United States

***Applicants who do not meet the GPA threshold may still apply to the program and their application would be considered, but the program must submit an admission petition to the Dean of the Graduate School before an offer is made. STR evaluates applications using a holistic review process that takes many factors into account – GPA is only one indicator.

Prerequisite Coursework, Classroom Observation

The Seattle Teacher Residency program does not have prerequisite coursework or classroom observation requirements. Although not strict admission eligibility requirements, these two opportunities may make an applicant more competitive in the admissions process.

Unofficial transcripts from all schools attended	Unofficial transcripts should be uploaded in the online application portal. Official transcripts will be required once admitted to the program.
Basic Skills Test (WEST-B) scores	All Washington teacher candidates are required to take a basic skills assessment in reading, writing, and math. <u>WEST-B</u> is the "official" test for Washington state. ACT, SAT, PRAXIS I, and <u>some other tests</u> may also serve as a substitute for this exam.
Bachelor's degree	Your bachelor's degree (or equivalent) must be conferred by the time the program begins.

The NES is not required for admission, but will be required for eventual full certification.

NES subject test	NES Elementary Education subtests I and II (tests 102 and 103) must be passed by March of the residency year. SPED Pathway Residents must also pass WEST-E Special Education by this date.
