### **STR Application Timeline for Cohort 10 (Summer 2022 through Summer 2023)**

There are two application cycles for the Seattle Teacher Residency program. Both application cycles are for the cohort beginning in late June 2022.

<b>Application Cycle</b>	<b>Deadline</b>	<b>Selection Day*</b>	<b>Final Decision Notification Date</b>
Early Application Window	October 22, 2021	December 2021 (exact date TBD)	January 21, 2022
Final Application Window	January 21, 2022	March 2022 (exact date TBD)	April 8, 2022

\*Selection Day takes place on the University of Washington-Seattle campus and is a full day consisting of interviews and performance tasks and is a requirement for admission into STR.

### **Eligibility**

To apply for the Seattle Teacher Residency program, you must:

- Hold a 4-year bachelor's degree by the time the program starts
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA\*\*
- Be legally authorized to work in the United States

\*\*Applicants who do not meet the GPA threshold may still apply to the program and their application would be considered, but the program must submit an admission petition to the Dean of the Graduate School before an offer is made. STR evaluates applications using a holistic review process that takes many factors into account – GPA is only one indicator.

### **Classroom Observation and Prerequisite Coursework**

The Seattle Teacher Residency program does not have classroom observation or prerequisite coursework requirements. Although not strict admission eligibility requirements, these opportunities often help an applicant be more competitive in the admissions process.

### **Summer 2022 Program Calendar\*\*\***

Daily attendance during summer is mandatory and personal days (for weddings, travel, appointments, etc.) are not allowed during this initial quarter. Summer Quarter 2022 for STR Cohort 10 starts on June 20, 2022 and runs through August 12, 2022. Plan on daily attendance from 8am-5pm Monday through Friday. Residents then have a short break from August 15-19 before returning to prepare for the start of the school year on August 22.

\*\*\*All summer calendar dates are tentative and may be modified due to factors (inclement weather, final 2022-23 school year calendar board approval) extending the Seattle Public Schools school year.

<u><a href="#">Statement of Purpose</a></u>	3 sections - prompts based on selection criteria
<b>3 <u><a href="#">Reference Assessment Forms</a></u></b>	<u><a href="#">Reference forms</a></u> should be submitted to <a href="mailto:eduapp@uw.edu">eduapp@uw.edu</a> by the application deadline
<b>Unofficial transcripts from all schools attended</b>	Unofficial transcripts should be uploaded in the online application portal. Official transcripts will be required once admitted to the program.
<b>Basic Skills Test (WEST-B or equivalent)</b>	All Washington teacher candidates are required to take a basic skills assessment in reading, writing, and math. <u><a href="#">WEST-B</a></u> is the "official" test for Washington state. ACT, SAT, PRAXIS I, and <u><a href="#">some other tests</a></u> may also serve as a substitute for this exam.
<b>NES Content Knowledge Tests</b>	All applicants must take <u><a href="#">NES Elementary Education subtests I and II</a></u> (tests 102 and 103) must be taken before the program start date. Passage of these subtests are a requirement for teacher certification.
